About BIA

The Bulgarian Industrial Association – Union of the Bulgarian Business was founded in 1980 as the first non-governmental business organization in the former socialist block. From its very establishment, even in a time of planned economy and strong political coercion, BIA has succeeded in implementing some market principles which were modern for its time and are still regarded as such today.

Later on during the political transition, BIA took an active part in the processes of regulation change which occurred in the economic sphere and the launch of social dialogue in the country.

BIA facilitated Bulgaria's accession to the EU by setting up an EU-Bulgaria Joined Consultative Committee and functioned as a co-chair on the Bulgarian part for as long as two mandates.

The Association played a crucial role in the foundation, support and recognition of the branch, regional, business and employers' organizations in Bulgaria. The establishment of regional industrial associations and chambers started back in 1982. During 1990s BIA encouraged and rendered methodological support to the processes of setting up branch (sector) chambers, unions and associations, applying the experience of the advanced European states.

BIA is the only national business organization in Bulgaria that has attracted large scientific organizations and universities for its members, which is of particular importance for the processes of technological renovation and innovations, and for establishing a more direct link between science and business. The Bulgarian Academy of Sciences and the biggest Technical Universities in Bulgaria are our undisputable partners in this endeavor.

Ever since its foundation, BIA has kept a close contact and partnership with the representatives of the Cooperative Movement in Bulgaria, which has over a hundred-year history.

During its thirty-year history BIA has proved to be the leading business organization in Bulgaria, recognized both nationwide and worldwide, a reliable and trustworthy partner, incorporating the efforts and visions of the country's entire business and scientific spectrum concerning the competitive economy development. Nowadays, it is fair enough to say that BIA's professionalism and ability to maintain its positions, by simultaneously respecting the opponents' opinion, has turned BIA into a widely acknowledged and respected partner both on a national and international level.

BIA actively participates in the work of the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC). BIA has signed cooperation agreements with over 80 national business and employers' organizations from the most developed countries in Europe, Asia, Africa and the USA.

Using Money in Bulgaria

Money can be exchanged in banks and change bureaus. Ask the hotel reception to recommend a bank or bureau nearby. Visa, Mastercard, American Express and Diner's Club cards are accepted at almost every establishment that accepts payment by credit card. If any of the following logos appear on your card: MasterCard, VISA, AMEX, Diners Club or Discover you will be able to withdraw money from the ATMs in Sofia. It is important to check whether your home bank has authorized your card for international use if you plan on using a debit card.

Power Supply

220V ±10% electrical supply. Supply frequency is 50Hz Plug socket in use is the two-pinned Type F, also known as "Schuko"
